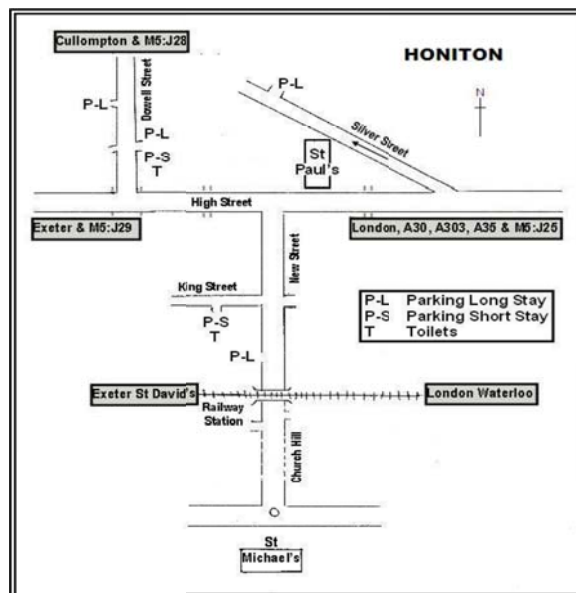
St Paul's Forecourt

Hiring the Church buildings

St Paul's and The Mackarness Hall

St Paul's Church, Honiton

St Paul's is available for hire outside service times. It has been successfully used in the past for Concerts and Exhibitions

The building of St Paul's began in 1835 on the site of the old Allhallows School Chapel. It was dedicated by Henry Philpotts, Bishop of Exeter, in 1838, the year after Queen Victoria came to the throne. The building was designed by Charles Fowler, a Devon architect who chose a Norman/Romanesque style with rounded arches built from local chert and Beer stone. The tower is a conspicuous landmark both in the town and the Otter Valley. It is 104 feet high and houses a clock made in 1851.

The Mackarness Hall, Honiton

The Hall is located next to the church on the West side.

It comprises a main hall with serving area and well-equipped kitchen.

The Hall is fully accessible and has disabled toilet facilities.

The Facilities

St Paul's

- Maximum permitted seating capacity approximately 235 in central area, plus 80 on chairs in the Narthex.
- Greenroom facilities are available in the Crypt and/or Choir Vestry.
- Kitchen and toilet facilities adjoin the Narthex.
- Lighting and electrical heating are included in the hire charge.
- Stage floodlights exist in the form of two tripods each with two 500W lights.
- A "loop system" exists for deaf and substitute hearing aid.
- Wheelchair access exists to the Church but not to the Crypt.
- Emergency exits exist at the front and rear of the Church (the latter involves some old stone steps).
- A television and video/DVD are available for hire.
- Assistance to convert the layout for concerts will be chargeable

Performing Rights

As venues for public entertainment, St Paul's must pay Performing Rights when music is part of the event in either the Church or the Hall. A charge is therefore made to cover these costs and an appropriate form will be supplied to be completed by the event organiser. Details of this charge will be sent after the concert when the appropriate fee has been ascertained.

Other Considerations

Regular users can pay on invoice, but ad-hoc bookings must be paid in full in advance.

Parking

Please note there are no public parking spaces on the Church premises.

There are, however, short- (3 hours max) and long-stay car parks near to St Paul's (in King Street, New Street, Silver Street, and Dowell Street).

Please note that free parking on the High Street, where permitted, is limited to one hour.

Parking is free and *not* restricted on Sundays

Parking in front of the Mackarness Hall is restricted to loading and unloading only. Please note that there is limited width and turning of vehicles may not be possible. There is a designated loading bay in front of the church.
